### **SUMMER CAMP RECAP!**

What an amazing summer! During June and July, over 150 staff and volunteers welcomed 584 campers during our 6 youth camp sessions—33% growth in attendance over the last 5 years! About 70% of our campers attend a Church of God or other partner church; the remaining 30% come from other churches and organizations or no home church.

Through our scholarship fund, our generous donors and church partners were able to provide registration fee assistance to 47 campers who otherwise would not have been able to attend camp.

Our theme this year was TOGETHER, based on Romans 12:5: "so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others."

Our fantastic weekly program directors and staff and volunteer team helped our campers explore what it looks like to be the body of Christ using the examples given in Acts 2—learning, fellowshipping, eating, praying, meeting, sharing, giving, praising, and growing as one Church.

Although we love having fun and experiencing new things, our ultimate goal is for our campers to experience the life change possible through Jesus Christ. 95% of campers reported their relationship with God changed positively because of camp, and 114 campers made decisions to follow Jesus at camp. At the end of the camping season a work group completed three important projects: a storage shed at the paintball field, a couple of slides for our younger campers and guests a new deck at the service entrance of the dining hall.

God is using and blessing Camp Challenge! We always strive to be good stewards of

the resources we have. Our maintenance needs are still large for our existing buildings and at the same time we are looking at what we do next to improve the camp for the future. We will have some exciting opportunities to partner with Camp

Challenge during our "Giving Tuesday" and year end fundraising campaigns. Please watch for more info on those efforts and prayerfully consider what you may be able to give. Beyond those two efforts, one of the things that adds financial stability to our operations are recurring donations from individuals. We call them "fire circle" donors. Our donors currently give between \$10 and \$250 per month to our general fund, which pays for utility bills, liability insurance, office

> supplies, summer camp food, etc. It is one of the most important ways a person can be involved to ensure we have excellent camps each year. Our goal is to double our current number of individual monthly donors.
